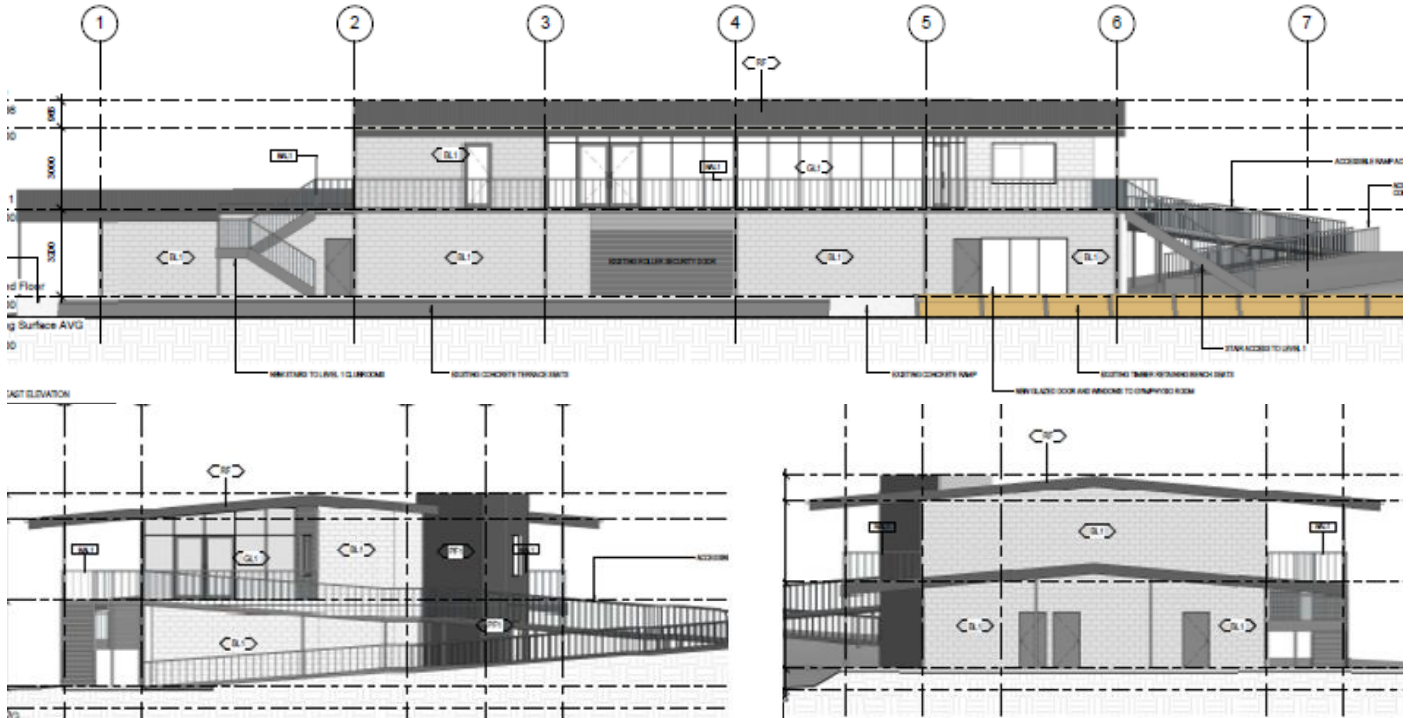

Presidents Report:

2018 has been an eventful year but first & foremost I would like to say a general thank you to all the committee members, volunteers, coaches, team managers, umpires, players, parents, sponsors & supporters for their efforts this year in making Greensborough Hockey Club the great family club that it is.

On the pitch there were no premierships in seniors or masters but two in juniors. Winning is not everything but it is always relished when it comes along. Our premiers were the U14 Girls & the U16 Mixed - which featured several girls - so I was especially happy that our junior girls had a big impact on the pitch this season given the recent challenge of attracting girls to hockey when competing with the vast resources of AFLW.

An area of concern for me is that the GHC Committee, the junior committee & the finance sub-committee spend a significant portion of their time chasing overdue accounts. Apart from taking up much of the valuable time of our volunteers, it is also money we don't have in the bank to offset against our ongoing loan for pitch resurfacing. This is a key reason why we have needed to maintain fees at their current levels & continue with the sinking fund levy in order to cover the costs of playing hockey & maintaining our facilities. A special thanks to our Hockey Operations team & all of the team managers for ensuring fines for late match results were kept to an absolute minimum which was a big improvement on previous years. The efforts of chasing overdue accounts & avoiding fines has had a big impact on our bottom line this year.

Other areas where the Committee was busy were making new offerings in the supporter wear department & implementing a new uniform for the top 2 men's & women's teams which seems to have been very well received. We have one more season of transition before the new uniform becomes compulsory across the club. Thank you especially to Stuart Young, Naomi Pickford, Alana McQueen, Heath Simpson & Emma Duncan for their assistance in this area.

Another well-publicized area of busy-ness was the proposed club room redevelopment. Will Creed, Michael McLean Jr & Greg Purser have spent untold hours of toil on this project to follow up on the efforts of previous Committee members with Bec Bartel & Murray Guy also likely to be heavily involved going forward. Architects have recently been appointed to the project after the Shire of Nillumbik & recently re-elected local member & club no. 1 ticket holder Danielle Green helped secure funding for the project. Watch this space! It might not only be a new uniform on display for the 2020 season...

The League Entry Criteria (LEC) requirements for maintaining Premier League status were again harder to achieve this year. In a sport which is stagnant in terms of playing numbers, we were one of many clubs to just scrape across the line. We will need to continue working hard as a club on increasing junior numbers along with umpire, coach & match official participation numbers to maintain this status. We will also need to do all we can & band together to prevent other clubs from poaching our best players with offers financial & otherwise in what remains an amateur sport. I like to think all at Greensborough play for the love of the game & the love of their club but this attitude is not prevalent across all clubs. For hockey to be sustainable going forward, clubs must produce their own elite players. We need to do all we can to protect our "assets" - those who have learned their trade via our junior hockey programme & are effectively repaying the club's investment in them when they reach the highest echelons, by helping not only on the pitch but also to help develop our juniors or in other ways. My heartfelt appreciation to those who choose to stay at Greensborough despite tempting offers from elsewhere.

The Junior Country Carnival (JCC) held at The Burra was a great success & financially means a lot to the club as it is our single biggest "fund raiser". A big thank you to all of those who helped us plan for & host this event. Similarly, the Michael McLean Sr Family Day was a fantastic day with Michael McLean Jr, Heath Simpson & Tegan de Man helping to "modernise" this day to make it accessible for all club members & generate a huge morale boost.

Thanks to Greg Pickford, Jono Doutre, Joe Hill, Bob Aldersea, Tegan de Man, Courtney Jacklin, Colin Riordan & Colin White for keeping things running in WPL, MPL, WPLR & MPLR respectively this year. The combined wisdom, leadership & commitment behind the scenes of this group does not go unnoticed. Greg Pickford has decided to pursue different roles at the club in 2019 & he is to be thanked for taking the helm & achieving great results over a period of transition in the WPL squad.

Congratulations to all of those who have been selected for representative teams in our region or state. A big shout out to Rachael Lynch who added another fantastic year to her outstanding career with the Hockeyroos. We hope to have her back in the future, but not just yet as the Hockeyroos still need you Rach!

Another notable achievement this year was Stephanie Riordan breaking the club record for appearances in the 1st XI. Her 361 appearances after debuting as a 14 year old in 2000 is an amazing achievement in a decorated career at club & state level. My personal congratulations to Steph on this achievement after surpassing David Lumb's games record during the season & we wish you well in your retirement from WPL hockey. It is hard to imagine this record being broken in the modern game but we have youngsters in & around the top squads already so you never know. Speaking of Premier League, thank you to Ian Hooper & the BBQ crew for some fantastic food options on home days, to Jordan

Mulvaney for providing camera equipment & to Sean Mulvaney for assisting the President with recording of MPL & WPL matches. Summer NDHL was again a great success across the Summer of 2017-2018 & we have kicked off another record-breaking season in October 2018. Special thanks to Stuart Young & the "Young Ladies", Young Lady-in-law Leanne Reeves & the team managers for their efforts to make this happen.

Regarding our juniors, I handed over the reins to Brendan Carmody this season. Brendan has a great passion for our club & hockey in general which only ageing hamstrings have managed to curtail. Brendan has done an admirable job along with his junior committee, junior coaches & team managers. Taking hockey to the local schools continues to be a crucial task in the survival of our club & of hockey in general. I especially thank Ken Parkin, Erika Newbegin, Brenten Coulthard, Naomi Pickford, Deb Purser, Rob Zull & Dane van Meeuwen for their efforts in this area. Thanks also to Jeff Dunn & Rod Kay who have helped bring on our young umpires over the last few years.

Our junior NDHL programme faced challenges this year with a big drop off in female participation which is likely related to Aussie Rules for girls booming locally. Thank you to the coaches who turned up every week to ensure those who came were offered a quality product & a fantastic hockey introduction. Thanks especially to Brenten Coulthard for overseeing the entire operation, to Greg Pickford & the WPL(R) ladies for making it happen in term 2, Joe Hill, Heath Simpson & the MPL(R) lads for their term 3 efforts & let us not forget Mandy Hackart, Yvette Consolino & others who were there to help all year.

Cath Ludwick, Deb Purser, Erika Newbegin & other valuable helpers have kept the canteen open as often as possible this year despite senior teams not being allocated to a roster to assist as in previous years. We thank them for this & hope we can share the load better in 2019.

Sponsors are a major reason for our club continuing to run smoothly. Please be sure to use the services of those who have chipped in & have a sign on display in the club rooms or on the pitches. They often provide their services to the club at no charge & we should support them wherever possible. Others such as Greg Pickford & Luke Chiodo provide their electrical & welding services ad hoc when asked & this is much appreciated. Just Hockey, Simply Helping & Bendigo Bank have made significant contributions this year & are a major reason why this club can continue operating. I thank them personally & on behalf of the Committee & club members.

It has been a pleasure to see life member Murray Guy at many of the Premier League home games this year. I enjoy seeking out Murray & other life members such as Robert Kennedy, Colin Riordan, Jim Irvine, Ian Ludwick, Carol Brewster, Carlie Day, Bob Aldersea & Paul de Man for a quick chat & to pick their brains when I see them although I am unable to do this as often as I would like. I also had the pleasure of meeting life member John Glover for the first time recently. There is much to learn from these old hands & those who cannot learn from history are condemned to repeat it...

Of course, it would be remiss of me not to mention the spectacular effort of my fellow committee members in 2018. Strangely enough, every year all the volunteers at the club seem to get another year older & we must be wary of "volunteer fatigue" - it's a real thing. As Homer Simpson might say, we need 3 types of volunteers in 2019 - more volunteers, younger volunteers, & more volunteers! Special thanks to the departing committee members. Defrim Kutrolli stayed on as Treasurer in 2018 despite his daughters temporarily not playing at the club this season. Treasurers Report:

The Financial Result for 2018 was a net Loss of \$(11,167) which compares to a Loss of \$(2,689) for 2017, a deterioration of \$(8,478). The main drivers were:

- Amortisation of the Hockey Pitch due to full year depreciation (2017 partial year) – up by \$15,869
- Interest charges on the Loan facility due to full year expense (2017 partial year) – up by \$8,668
- Reduction in number of players in men, masters & juniors – Fees down by about \$8,000
- Because of this & together with lower spectator numbers at games, net profit on the Bar & Canteen was down by about \$6,000
- No social functions for the year so net income in this area was down by about \$2,400

Highlights for the year:

- Sponsorship – another good year – about \$12,000 – marginally down on 2017. Bottom line is that without this substantial sponsorship, Club Fees would need to be higher to fund the operating costs of the club. Main contributors were:
 - Simple Helping - \$5,500 for cleaning of club rooms, toilets & changerooms. In other words, no charge for the fine work they did throughout the year
 - Just Hockey - \$2,000 as part of the arrangement with the Hockey Shop
 - Department of Health & Human Services Sports Grant of \$1,000
 - Bendigo Bank - \$900 for face masks for Juniors & the good news about Bendigo Bank is that they have already contributed another \$6,500 just recently for the 2019 season due to the hard work by James Dunell. The money will be used to fund the purchase of new set of goals
- Growth in women’s playing numbers – Club fees up by \$1,700
- Junior Country Championship – Net profit of \$7,700
- Maintenance & repairs down by \$11,000
- Coaching fees down by \$14,000
- Summer Hockey continues to thrive
- The Loan Facility down to \$373,209 from \$417,360, a decrease of \$44,151. Unfortunately, the interest rate has gone up though from 5.26% to 5.56%
- Available for Redraw as at 31 October 2018 – about \$70,000
- Continue to put money aside through the Sinking Fund Levy for Pitch Resurfacing in future years
- Bad debts down from \$5,800 to about \$1,400, an improvement of \$4,400. The bad debts figure of \$1,400 for 2018 all relates to unpaid club fees from the 2017 season
- For the 2018 season, there are still Unpaid Club Fees amounting to about \$3,600 which compares to \$4,440 at the same time last year. Obviously, it’s very disappointing there are still unpaid club fees at this time of the year, but it is hoped that most of the \$3,600 will be collected by the end of the year. These people are simply creating unnecessary work for the Committee which is under resourced & bluntly, can be better utilised doing more productive things. Quite plainly, they are not doing the right thing & are letting you guys, their team mates & friends down

Defrim Kutrolli – Treasurer

Secretary Report:

Clubrooms / Facility:

My main-focus this year has been on the clubrooms redevelopment. In a State election year the timing was perfect to lobby our local candidates and councillors to finally get the clubrooms finished. At a meeting in late 2017, Councillors inspected the clubrooms and all agreed that what we had was unacceptable. Meetings with Danielle Green & Merelyn Klein (our two Yan Yean candidates), were also very productive with both pledging support for the project.

Will Creed did a fantastic job with developing the concept plans required for the project application & Danielle Green told me she generally gets hand drawn concept plans on the back of serviettes.

The Council estimate for the project was \$4M, with a proposed funding arrangement of Council \$800k, Club \$200k & Funding Application \$3M, that we agreed to.

In May, Council endorsed the re-development project. In June the funding application was lodged with the State Government, & in Sep we were advised by Danielle that while Councils request for \$3M had not been successful, we had been granted \$2M toward the project. Unfortunately, this leaves us with a shortfall of around \$1M, but we are working with Council & State Government to see how this can be overcome.

In the mean-time the project has commenced with a tender for Architectural Services already being awarded & our first meeting with Council Officers & the Architects on 18-Dec.

The next major deadline is to have detailed designs completed by May-2019 so we can go to tender for appointment of a builder.

Summary:

- Completed concept designs for the redevelopment project
- Received Local Member & Councillor support for a funding submission
- Received funding allocation of \$2M from the State Government Growing Suburbs Fund
- Council application for its \$800k contribution was rejected by SRV & we are working through this at present
- Architect was appointed 28-Nov and we will start shortly on developing the detailed designs
- There's a lot to do in the next 12 months, but Council is required to complete the redevelopment by Jan-20 as part of the funding arrangement.

Grounds:

- Completed annual surface cleaning & brushing of the playing surface on both grounds
- Completed repairs to the carpark ground (under warranty)
- Received sponsorship of \$6,500 from Bendigo Bank for new goals to be delivered for the 2019 season

Canteen / Bar:

- Thank you to all members who helped with the Canteen roster. Without your assistance, we would need to increase fees and employ someone to run it.

Senior Team Reports:

Men's Premier League 1:

SEASON OVERVIEW:

The season was always going to be different from recent years due to the significant number of changes in players from last season. The job was made harder by several long-term injuries to key players & mid-season holidays. However, in adversity always comes opportunity & achievement.
