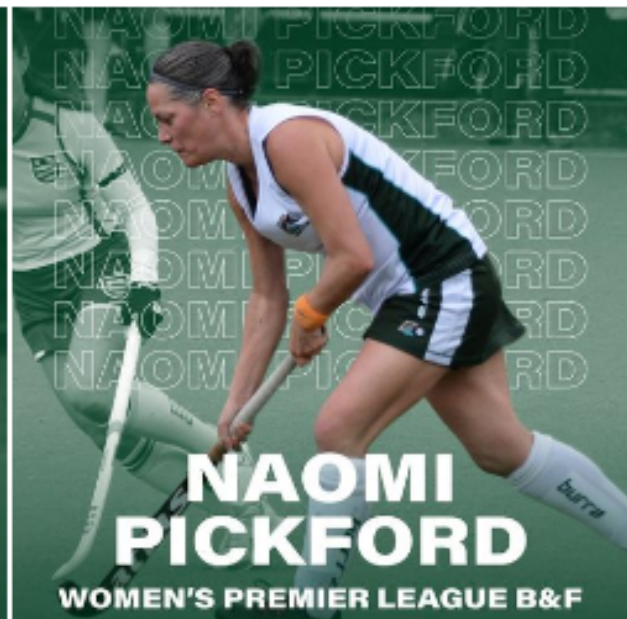

It's often difficult to balance work, family & other commitments & still find time to assist in keeping the club running. However, we strongly encourage all our members to consider what role they could play in supporting the club & the committee, there are always small roles & having assistants to such roles as secretary, treasurer, junior coordinators & canteen mean that all the jobs can be divided up to make it easier for everyone.

We completed the project to install Solar Panels with battery storage at a cost of \$45,000 that we only had to contribute 50% to due to a successful funding application in 2022. This project will not run the ground lighting but is covering the electricity running costs of the clubrooms, which will save us around \$5,000 pa.

In July we ran the "Inaugural" Burra Reunion Day with over 100 past players attending, including some from interstate. We plan to run the event annually in July but advertise in Jan each year, so those past members no longer living nearby have plenty of time to organise themselves.

We also implemented an "Indigenous" playing uniform with the help of Nathan McGuire who organised the design & sponsorship. The plan is to wear the uniform in the NAIDOC round each year & on other special occasions. Sam Northey was a worthy winner of "Player of the Match" in this year's NAIDOC round.

We also worked hard to attract new players & were not only successful in regaining the services of Josh Pollard, Casey Hammond, Byron Walton, Nathan McGuire & Courtney Rudd, but also gained the services of four overseas players, Jordi Gifra (ESP), Ignasi Vilumara (ESP), Chiara Ballarina (ARG), Vallantina Rovetto (ARG) & Dylan Edge from South Australia.

It is important that we continue to attract the right players who can help us regain our position as a high performing Premier League club while we continue to rebuild our junior program to ensure we develop our own players.

Our Pennant A team put in a remarkable effort in the 2023 season. We faced numerous challenges, but we rose to the occasion. Looking back, we want to extend our gratitude to the Mentone Hockey Club for their decision not to accept promotion to the Pennant A grade competition which allowed us to stay rather than having to drop into Pennant B after finishing 9th in 2022.

Interestingly, the decision turned out to be beneficial for both teams. Mentone did well in the Pennant B Finals, & Greensborough excelled in advancing to the Pennant A Finals. Over the past few years, our team often found itself in the lower half of the competition, struggling with player selection. What changed this season was the return of several players to the club, strengthening our side.

The renewed enthusiasm among our players was evident in their dedication to performing well & being part of our team. This enthusiasm was visible on the training field and, importantly, on the playing field. It enabled us to promote young talents like Daniel Retief & Aidan Carmody to play at this level.

Acknowledging everyone's contributions & considering injuries & unavailability, we relied on over 30 players throughout the season. This depth proved valuable in ensuring we maintained a competitive team each round.

We'd like to express our gratitude to all the players who got involved, & we'd like to highlight a few who made significant contributions. Our results included 10 wins, 2 draws, & 6 losses, with us scoring 41 goals. Kudos to Jarryd Purser for his 8 goals, closely supported by Stephen Marks & Dane Van Meeuwen, each scoring 7.

Our team's defence was outstanding, conceding only 30 goals, making us the second-best defensive team in the grade. This was a pivotal factor in our journey to the final series.

school. This shift will enable us to deliver a more comprehensive & sustainable hockey program in collaboration with the schools. Additionally, we're aware that the new suburbs to the north of our hockey grounds represent a fresh & mostly untapped source of potential new club members.

Our main goal is to prioritize forming lasting friendships within our club. We're committed to building strong & enduring connections with the people we play with. These relationships go beyond the game & become lifelong friendships.

These bonds not only enhance our club experience but also shape our sense of belonging & community. They represent the enduring spirit of camaraderie that will stay with us throughout our lives, becoming an essential part of our shared history & identity.
